BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE TOOL:

This is a guide for group intervention with battered senior women living in shelters (called "Maisons d'hébergement").

The first section of the guide is about the problem of domestic violence among couples as well as the factors that require the use of group intervention.

The second section, "responding adequately to seniors," presents in detail the contents of the intervention program. The four main objectives of these group interventions are to: raise awareness about the problem of domestic violence; recognize how violence in couples is experienced; help participants regain power and evaluate the impact of this training on participants.

Finally you will find, appended, tools that can be useful for recruiting and selecting participants and a document on group facilitation skills.
